A) Welcome

B) Report from the Chair

A week after the Commission's last meeting, Dr. Hoemann met with Chancellor Simek to discuss the Commission's concerns regarding complaint procedures. Dr. Hoemann felt the meeting was positive and hopes to have the complaint procedures amended early next year. Simek will be attending our first meeting on January 12th, 2009.

The Diversity Council will be revamping its membership. They are creating by-laws and establishing five open seats open to anyone on campus. This is being done due to concerns about the Diversity Council's lack of diversity.

James DeVita, Roger Weaver, and George Hoemann have read the proposal for an LGBT resource center. The Commission is concerned that the proposed location is not sufficiently handicap accessible. However, the location will provide excellent visibility.

B) Awards Committee

There has been no official word about reducing the number of awards available to the Commission.

C) Development Committee

The development committee has organized a plan to examine the policies of schools that have surpassed UTK in their efforts to create a better climate for the LGBT community.

E) The Equity Committee

Research assignments have been distributed for the project examining the availability of domestic partner benefits for employees of major businesses in the area.

F) Resource Center Committee

The resource center committee met last week to identify their ideal resource center. They will likely meet next week to determine how this can be adapted to the space they expect to be allotted by the administration.

G) Voices of Diversity

Voices of Diversity attempts to augment the commission's goals by provide a way for LGBT students, faculty, staff, alumni and allies to share their experience with others. The goals of the project are to increase visibility, help LGBT students and faculty/staff realize they are not alone on campus, and develop a supportive learning environment for LGBT students.

Resources, including brochures and posters, are available on the web site (<http://lgbt.utk.edu>) for *anyone* who wants to help promote the project.

Members of the Commission are also encouraged to contribute their story to the project. This can be done in the form of writing or an audio interview. Contributors can also produce their own multimedia production. Resources for multimedia productions are available in Hodges Library.

Anonymous entries are accepted.

The communications committee and the Lambda Student Union will also be hosting the Breaking the Silence Film Festival on April 15th, 2009. The films will be student-created videos.

I) New Business

Lynn Sacco will be teaching a seminar for first-year students called 'Out at UT.' All students, however, are welcome to enroll in the seminar.
