Transferring Manure, Litter or Wastewater to a Third Party (Class I & II – Large and Medium CAFOs)

If a CAFO transfers more than 100 tons of manure, litter or process wastewater to a third party, the CAFO must provide the recipient of the waste with the most current nutrient analysis. The CAFO must also ensure the third party signs an Agreement for the Removal of Litter, Manure and/or Process Wastewater from a CAFO form (Tennessee CAFO Factsheet Appendix A).

Additionally, the CAFO must retain the records of the date, recipient's name and address, and approximate amount of manure, litter or process wastewater transferred to a third party for a minimum of five years (Tennessee CAFO Factsheet Appendix B).
