Dear Mr. Miller:

Mr. Brehm has sent me a copy of your letter of June 7th together with copy of his reply.

Mr. Brehm has made it clear that the book had nothing to do with Dr. Sprowls failure to be recommended for reappointment next year. He was not fitting into the general program of the place that he was called to fill and Dr. Thackston recommended that we make a change. All of the matter that was published did not come from the University but, as is indicated by Mr. Brehm, was a type of propaganda that was developed for another purpose.

When we invited Mr. Garrett we had no idea what his address would be. I rather suggested to him in the invitation that he give us a discussion of the general economic situation in this country. I had no idea before he spoke of what he was going to talk about and was a little surprised when the matter of evolution was discussed in the preliminary part of his address.

The first time I am in Nashville I will be very glad to talk over the situation confidentially with you.
