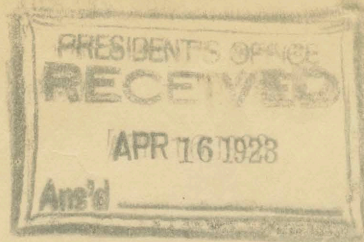

Dear Prof. Morgan:
