**ORDER OF DEFAULT AND DISMISSAL**

A Status Conference was held June 19, 2007 at 10:00 a.m.. A previous Order was sent June 8, 2007 notifying the parties of this status conference. The Grievant, Ms. Roberson, failed to participate in the conference. She also failed to provide a telephone number where she could be reached.

As a result of the Grievant's failure to participate in this conference, the Metropolitan Government moved for a default and dismissal pursuant to T.C.A. § 4-5-309 (a) which states: "If a party fails to attend or participate in a pre-hearing conference, hearing or other stage of a contested case, the administrative judge... may hold the party in default and either adjourn the proceedings or conduct them without the participation of that party, having due regard for the interest of justice and the orderly and prompt conduct of the proceedings."

The motion for Default is hereby granted and this matter is DISMISSED.
