Recent Accomplishments at UTK...

UTK Programs Among Nation's Best

U.S. News & World Report 1997 rankings placed the UTK College of Law 42nd in the nation and the UTK College of Business Administration graduate program 49th. Programs within the College of Business Administration achieved high rankings. The UTK Logistics and Transportation program ranked first in a survey of senior logistics executives conducted by the Foster Partners. UTK ranked sixth among colleges and universities with the strongest marketing programs in a survey by *TIME--The Princeton Review*.

The Master of Accountancy program in the UTK College of Business Administration moved up from tenth place in 1996 to eighth place in the 1997 rankings conducted by *Public Accounting Report*. The undergraduate program moved from 20th to 18th place among public and private universities.

UTK graduates finished college with less debt than students at all but four national universities, based on a survey by *U.S. News & World Report*. About 39 percent of UTK students graduate with debt averaging \$6,325.

Faculty Recognized for Scholarship and Service

Dr. Leonard Brinkman, Jr., associate professor of Geography, received the 1997 Outstanding Service Award from the UT, Knoxville Library Friends for decades of service.

Dr. Robert Uhrig, a distinguished professor of Nuclear Engineering, was appointed to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission's Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards. Uhrig is a Distinguished Scientist in the UT-ORNL Science Alliance Program.

Dr. Lorayne Lester was appointed dean of the College of Arts and Sciences in 1996. She is the first woman to hold this position. Dr. Lester has been a faculty member since 1960.

An ecologist from Florida State University, Dr. Daniel Simberloff, was appointed to the Nancy Gore-Hunger Chair of Excellence at UTK. This is the first appointment to an environmental studies chair that honors the late sister of Vice President Al Gore.

Stroud Watson of UTK's College of Architecture and Planning was one of five professors in North America named a distinguished professor by the Association of Collegiate Schools of Architecture. Watson was cited for his leadership in designing the Chattanooga cityscape.

Dr. Eric Davis of UTK's College of Veterinary Medicine led a group of students and veterinarians to Rosebud Sioux Indian Reservation in South Dakota to vaccinate, spay and neuter the reservation's large population of dogs and cats. Rabies is a significant problem on the reservation.

UTK Students Are Top Achievers

In the fall of 1997, UTK attracted 40 new National Merit Scholars, who were joined by 88 returning scholars, for a total of 128 National Merit Scholars at the University.

USA Today recognized two UTK students in a tribute to the nation's top students. Anita Karne and Mary Anne Peine, both Whittle Scholars in the College of Arts and Sciences, were among 124 students honored. Karne also was one of only 20 students nationwide to receive the Fulbright graduate student award to continue her studies in Britain.

UTK Masters of Business Administration students placed among the top three teams in three contests at the regional, national and international levels.

The senior honors project of Markus I. Woelfel earned the highest award of the National Collegiate Honors Council.

Annie DeBauche of Chattanooga was the first distance-learning graduate from UTK's College of Communications and the first UT student to earn a degree through interactive video courses. About 600 students took classes in UTK distance education programs in communications, information sciences, social work, engineering and human resource development in 1996.

Travis Wright, a Whittle Scholar at UTK, was chosen one of only 69 Truman Scholars nationwide for 1997. Wright was chosen from a field of 717 outstanding students for the \$30,000 award.

For the ninth time in 10 contests, a UTK student engineering team was among the top teams in a national competition for alternative fuel vehicles.

The 1997 Lady Vols under Coach Pat Summitt won their fifth NCAA Basketball Championship, retaining the national crown from the 1996 season.

The Vols under Coach Philip Fulmer won the SEC Conference Football Championship with a win over Auburn in Atlanta.

Number of Scholarships Awarded Climbs

In 1996-97, UTK awarded scholarships worth \$5,993,087 to 4,146 students -- up from 1992-93 when UTK awarded scholarships worth \$4,487,768 to 3,391 students.

UT's largest scholarship program celebrated its 25th anniversary in 1997. Since 1972, more than 4,200 Fred M. Roddy Scholarships have been awarded to UTK students. The Roddy Scholarship Endowment totals approximately \$3.3 million. The 128 recipients in 1997 had average GPAs of 3.74.

RECENT HIGHLIGHTS: Dr. Bill W. Stacy, founding president of California State University at San Marcos, became chancellor of UT-Chattanooga on August 1. Dr. Stacy, a native of Bristol, Tennessee, is the 14th individual to lead UTC or its predecessor institutions. He has been recognized nationally for his leadership in general education standards. The renovation of Fletcher Hall was completed in 1997. The \$8 million project doubles the usable classroom space, incorporating 21st century classroom technologies. Finley Stadium/Davenport Field was opened, replacing Chamberlain Field, the second oldest stadium in use in Division I football. The new facility seats 20,000.

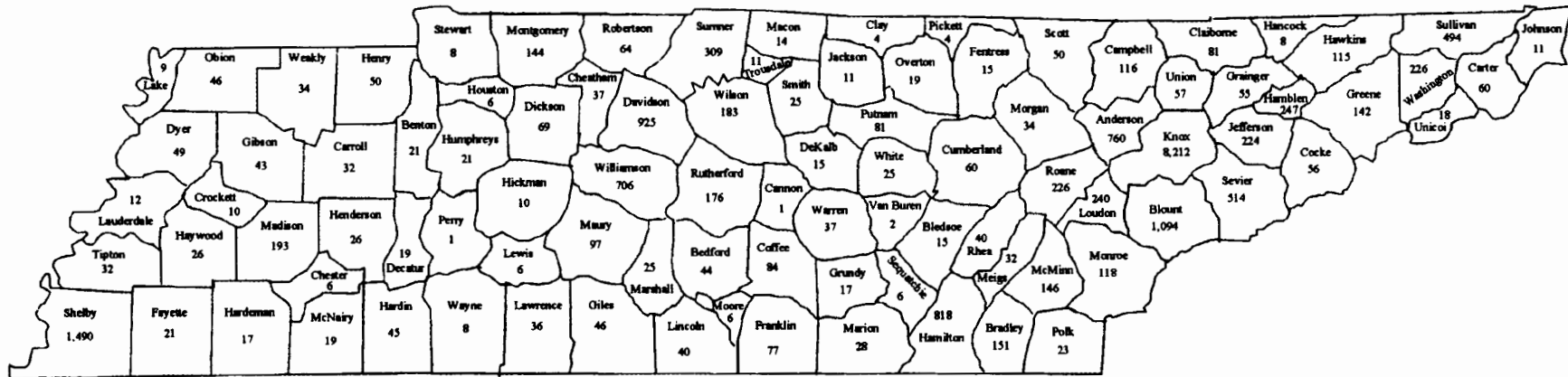

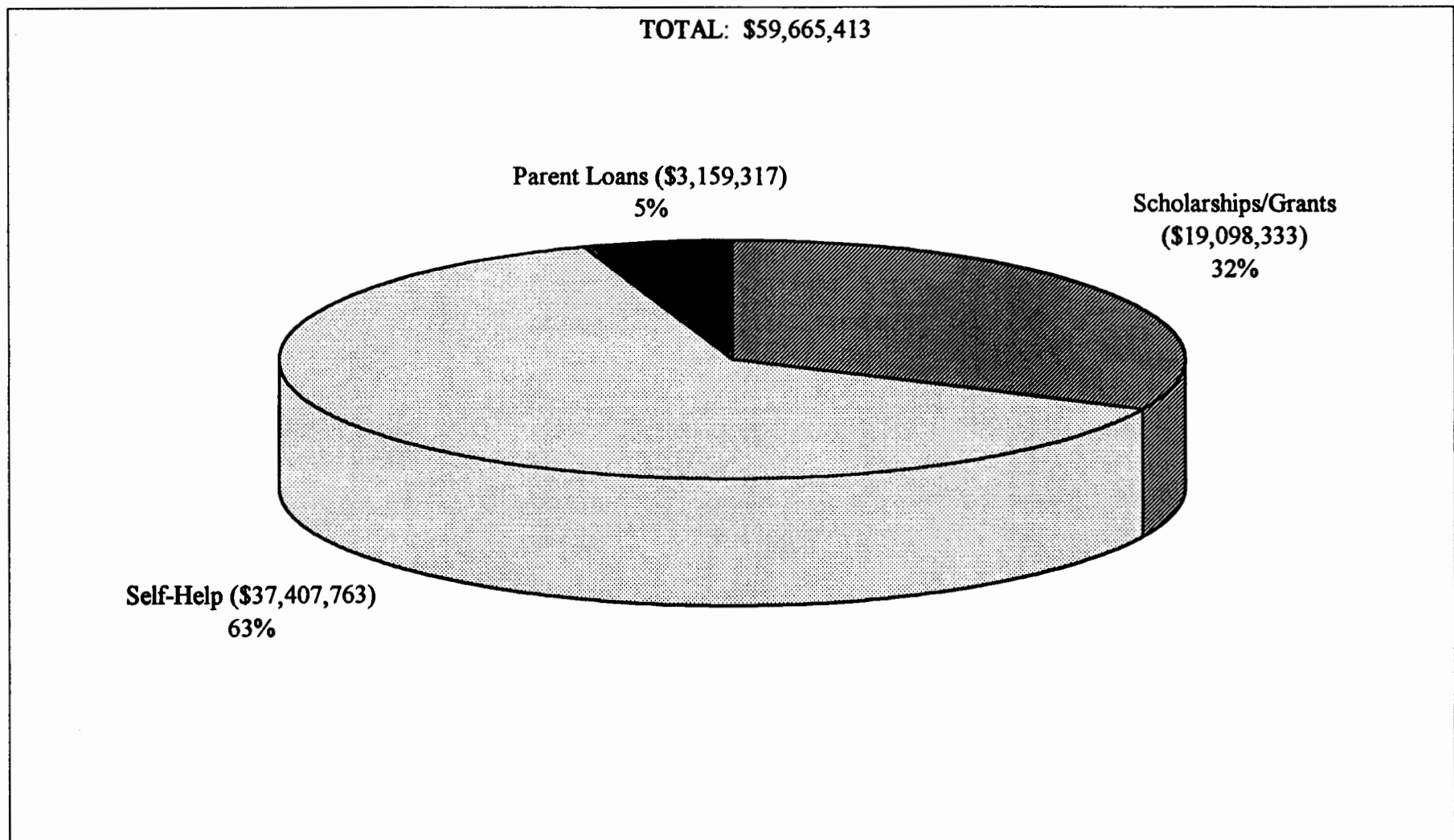

NEED-BASED FINANCIAL AID, ACADEMIC YEAR 1997-98



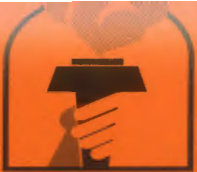

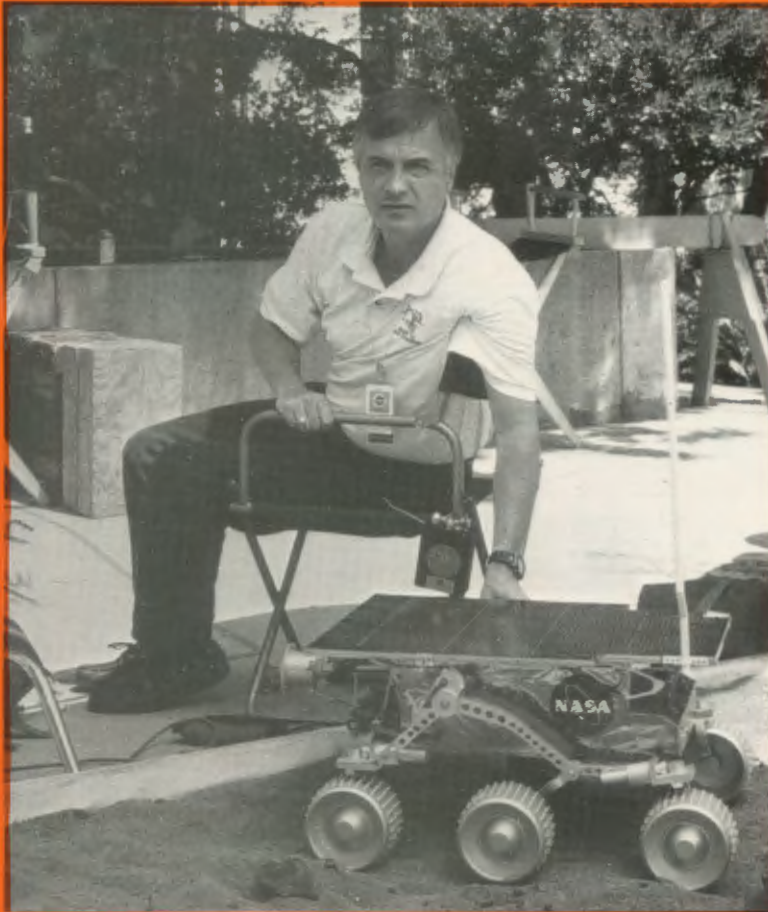

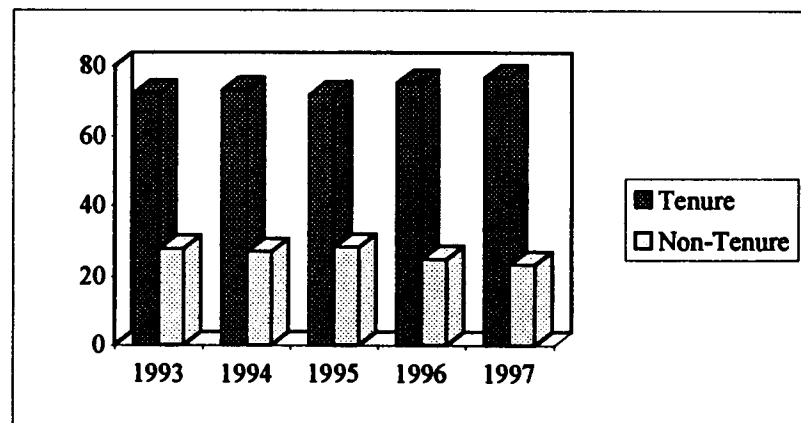

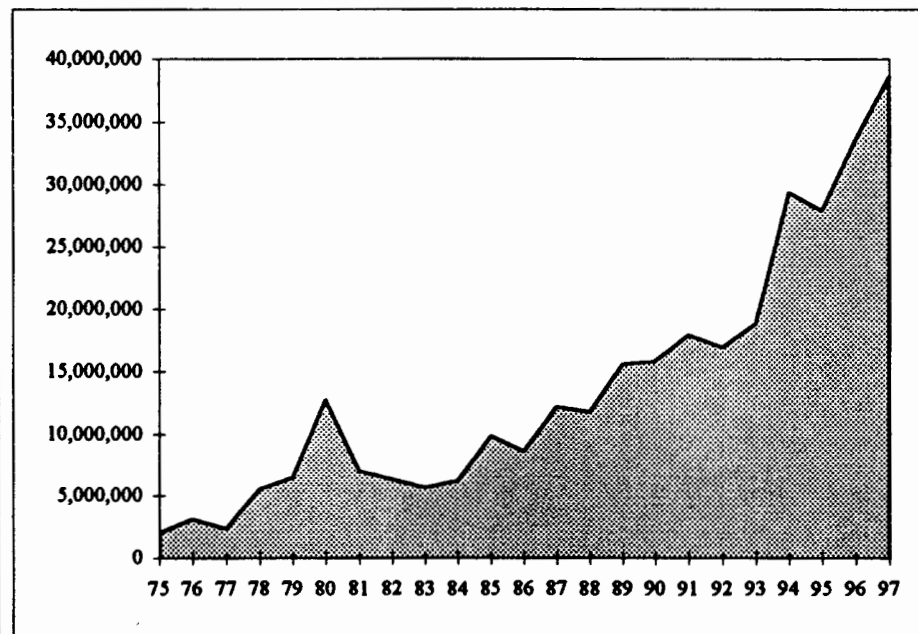

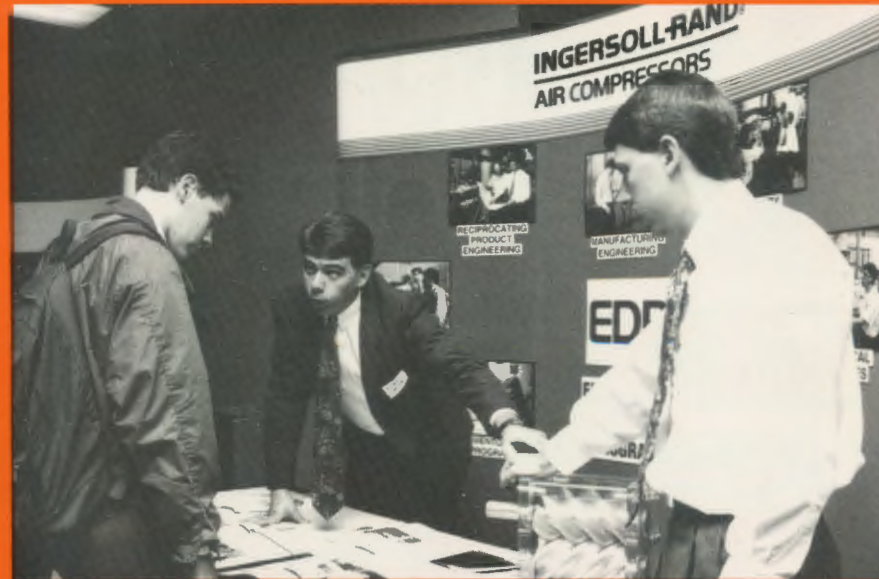

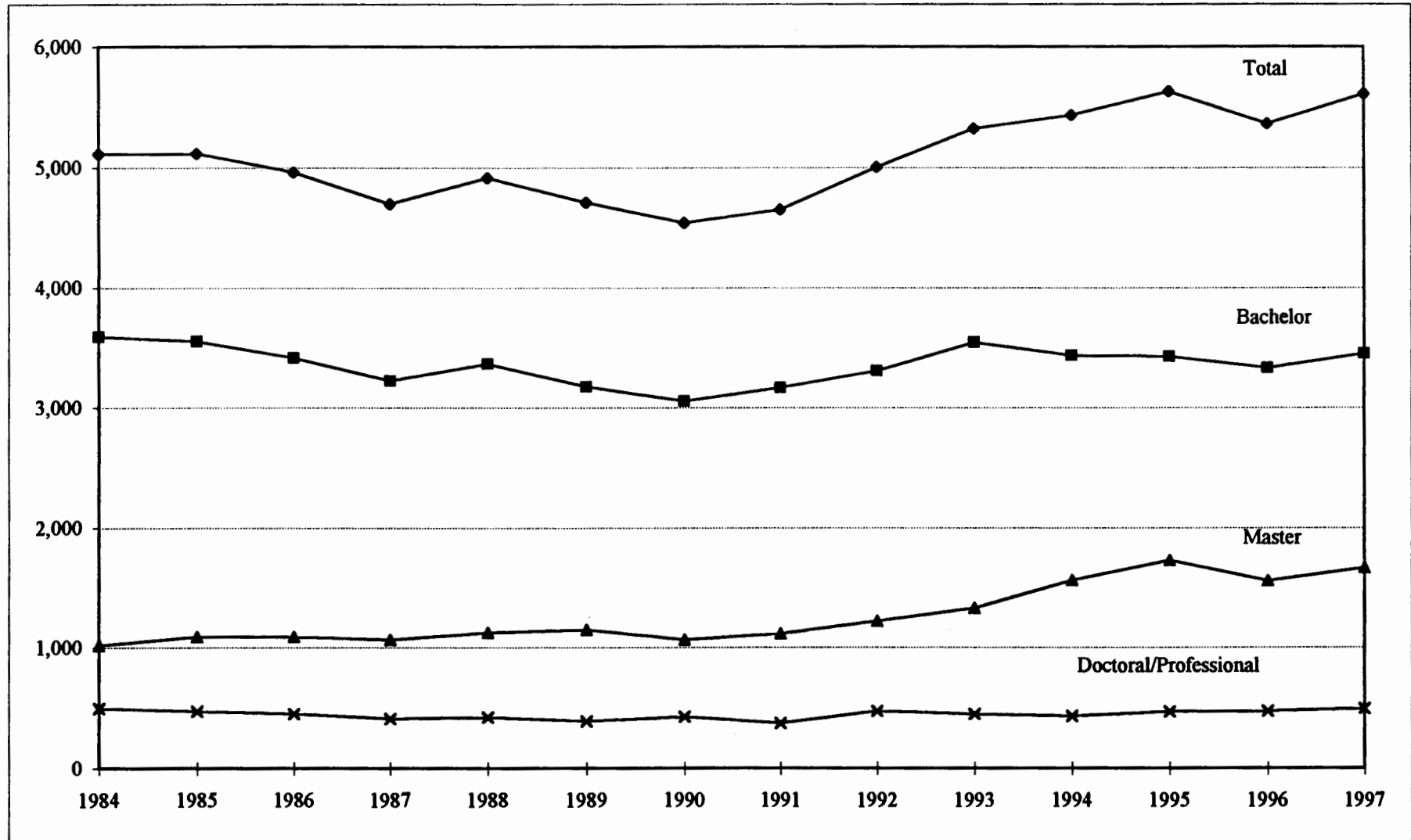

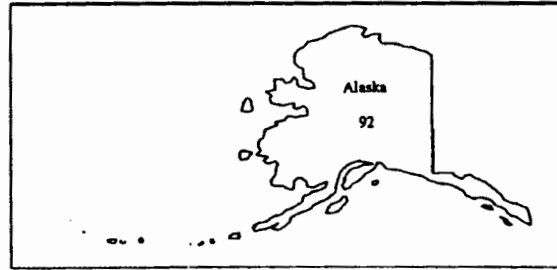

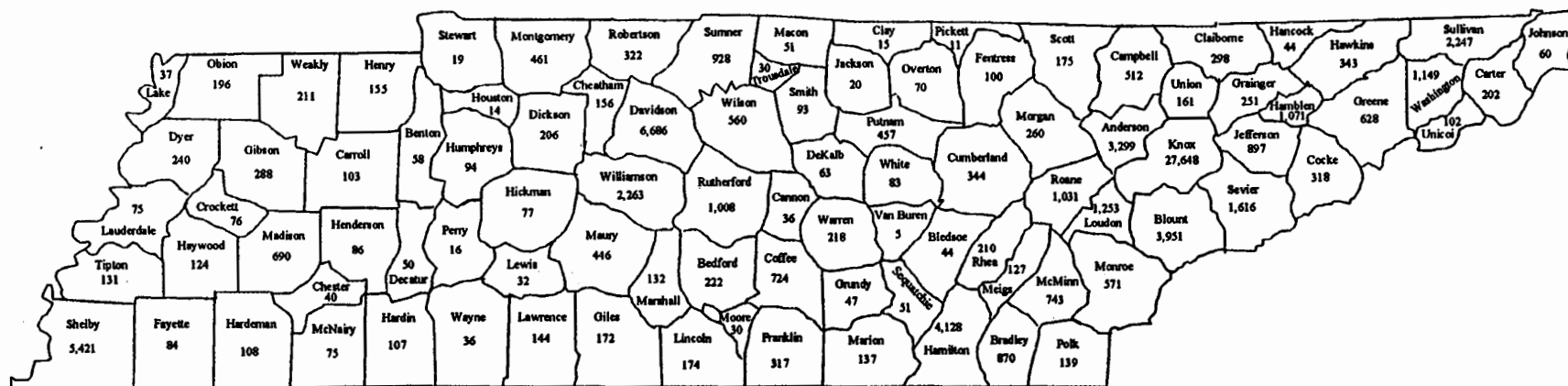

DISTRIBUTION OF UTK ALUMNI BY STATE



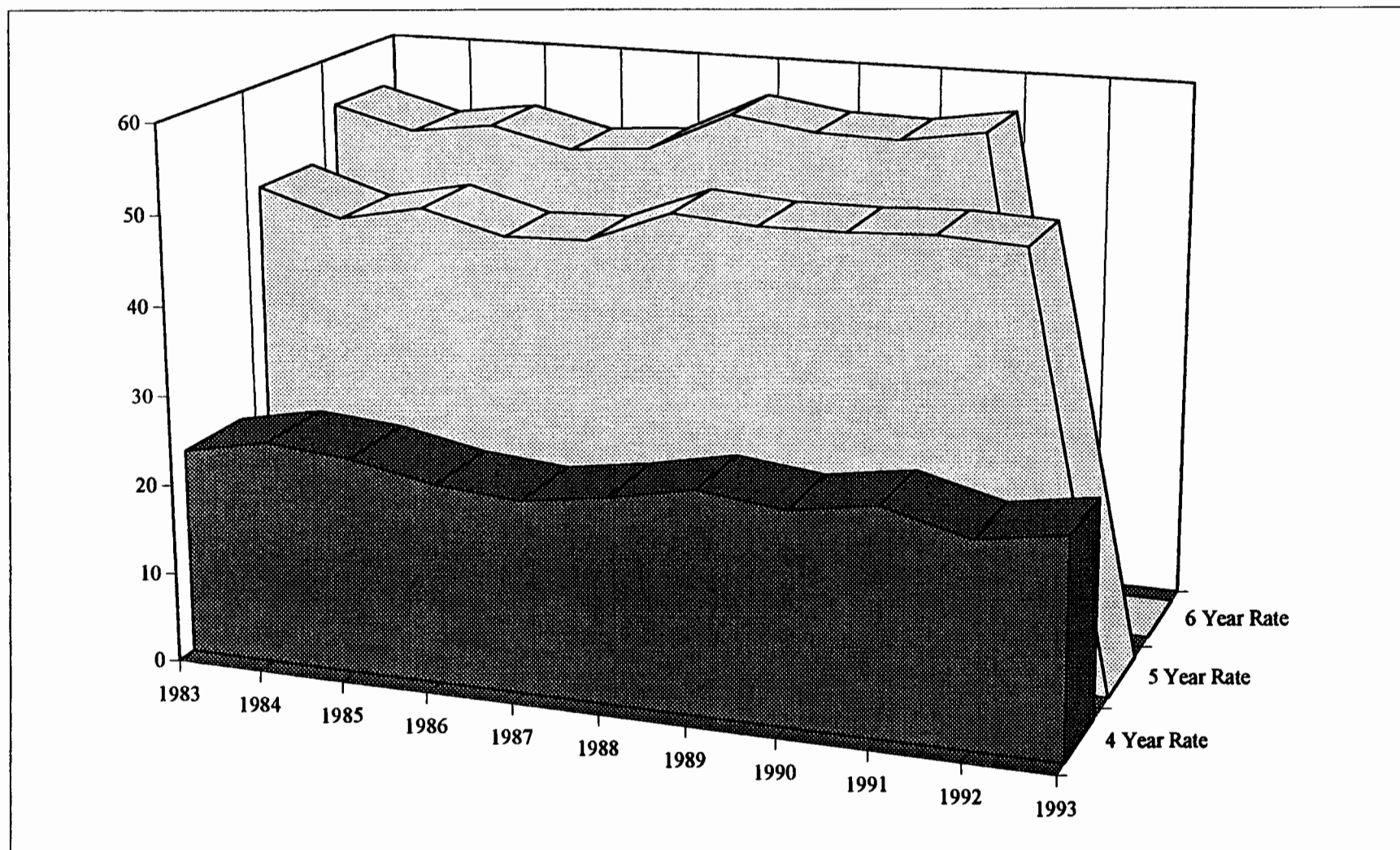

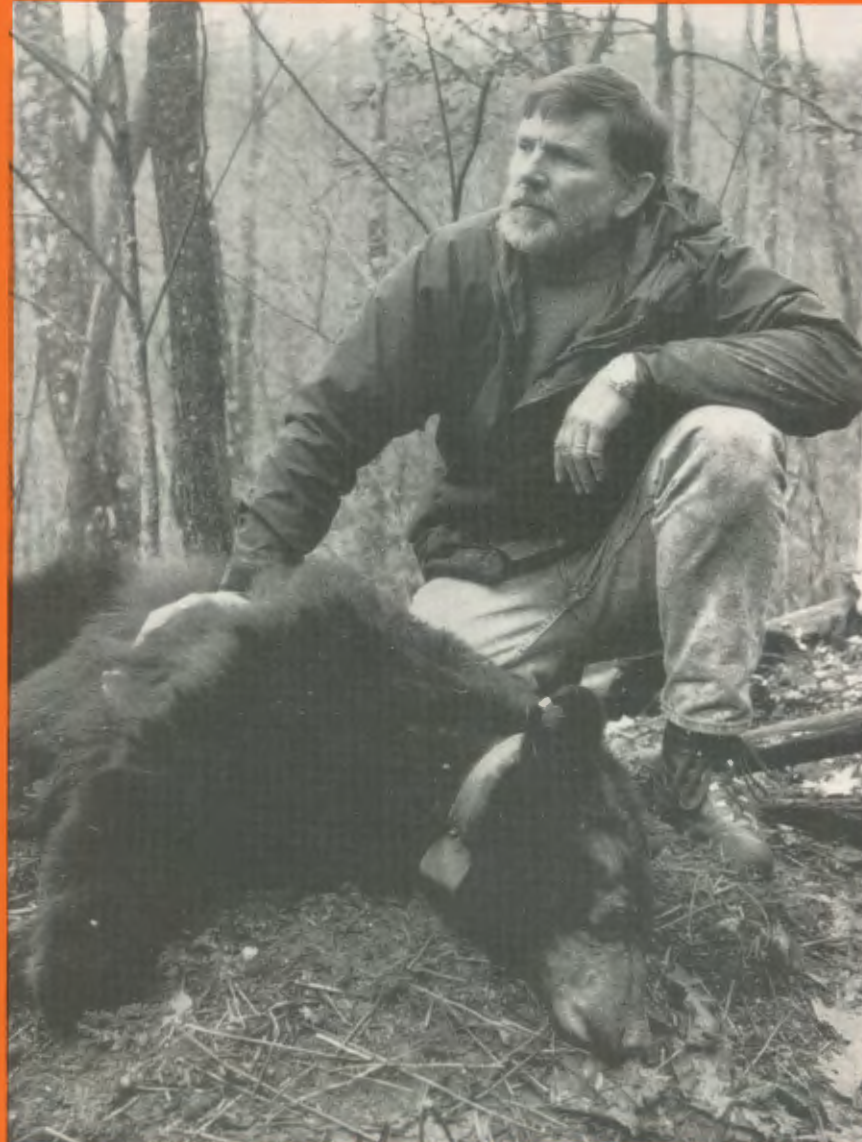
Dr. Hildegard M. Schuller, professor of comparative pathology at the UT College of Veterinary Medicine, was one of six finalists in the annual YWCA Tribute to Women Awards presentation. Nominated by the UTK Commission for Women, Dr. Schuller won the Human Services category for her research on how smoking affects the placenta in pregnant women and their children. She is a recipient of the Chancellor's Award for Research & Creative Achievements and the Distinguished Service Award from the Association of Women Veterinarians. Earlier in life, Schuller overcame amnesia following an accident at age 18. Everything she had learned had to be re-learned -- reading, math, and writing -- everything. "My way to success has been stoney," she said. "I am very thankful every day for the ability to think and do research," she said.

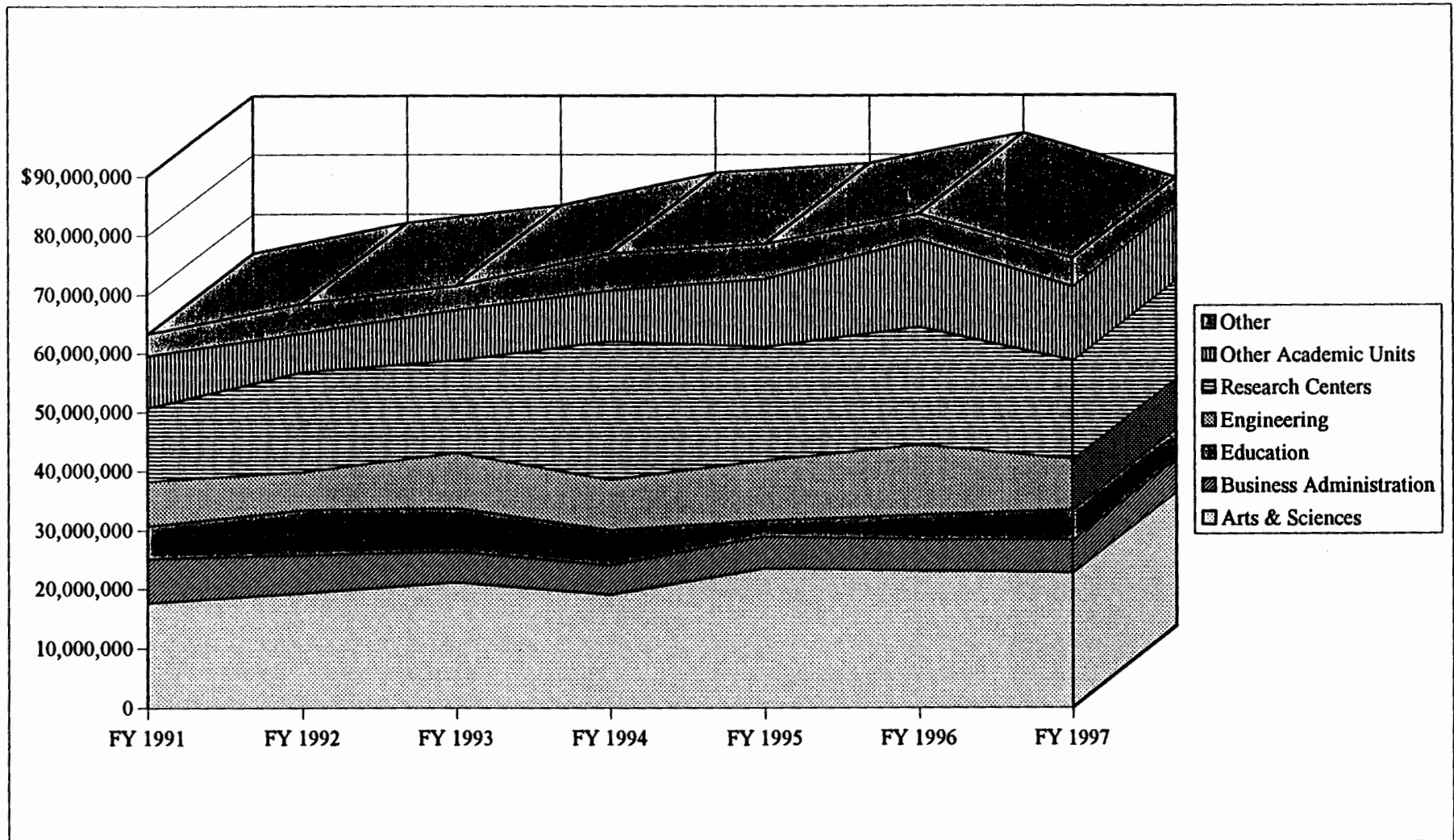

UTK SPONSORED PROGRAMS FUNDING BY MAJOR CAMPUS UNIT FY 1990-97



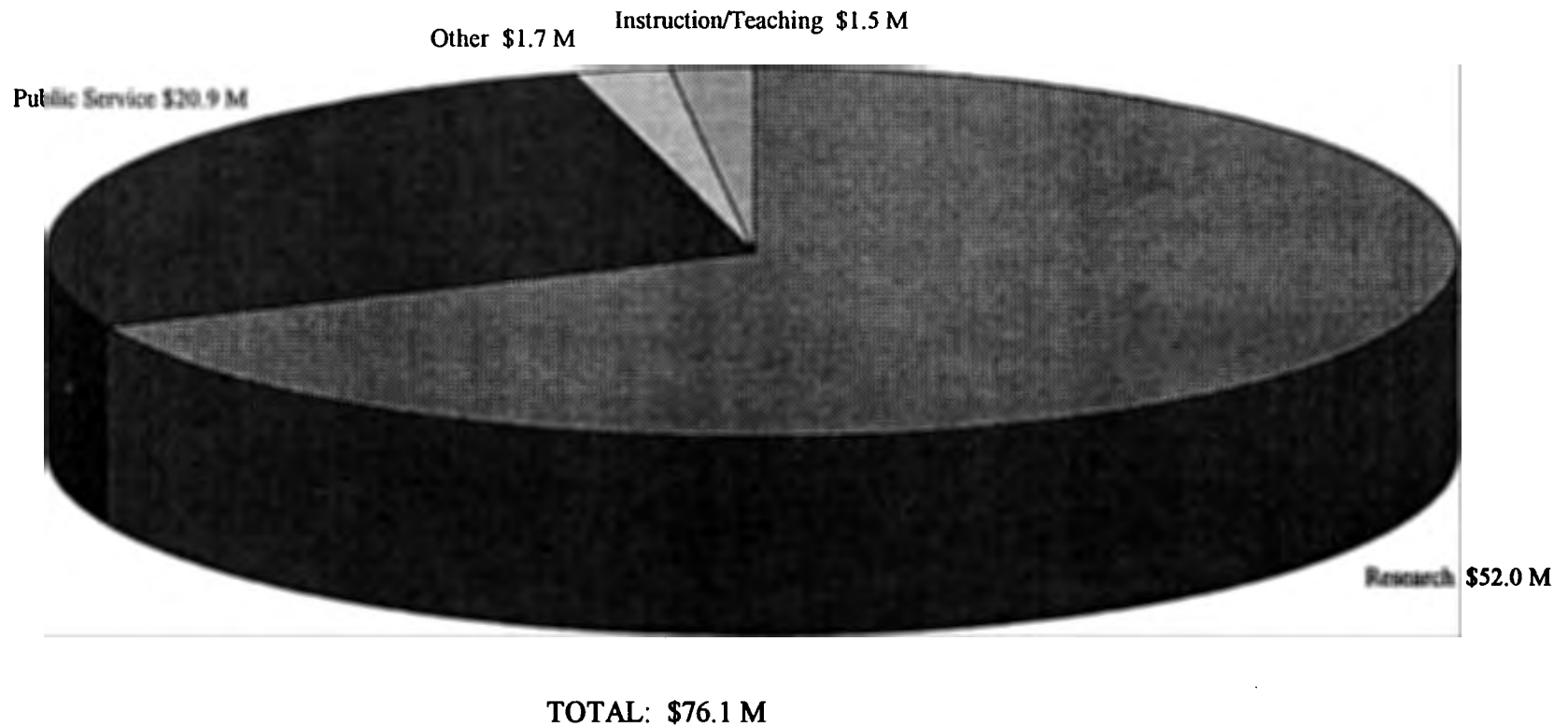
