HARRIETT GILL, Assistant Professor of Art Education, College of Education graduated from Milwaukee State College and studied at Cranbrook Academy of Art.

Miss Gill was a member of the faculty at Berea College, Berea, Kentucky, Ohio State University, and Assistant Director of the Craft Education Program of the Southern Highlands. She has served as art education consultant in the following summer education workshops: Emory University, Ga.; University of Wisconsin; Milwaukee State Teachers College; and the Pi Beta Phi, University of Tennessee Craft Workshop.

She has exhibited in the Designer-Craftsmen Shows in Milwaukee, the Art Center in Louisville, the National Ceramic Show in Syracuse, and was awarded the first prize in Ceramics at the Decorative Arts-Ceramics Show in Wichita, Kansas. She has recently had an exhibition in Berea.



JOSEPH COX, Associate Professor of Fine Arts, came to the University of Tennessee in September, 1948, from the University of Iowa, where he was a member of the Fine Arts faculty since 1939.

His formal training includes study at the John Herron Art School in Indianapolis and a graduate degree from the University of Iowa.

Mr. Cox has exhibited in many national and regional exhibitions, including the World's Fair, San Francisco, 1939; Carnegie exhibit, Pittsburg, 1941; Virginia Biennial; University of Iowa summer exhibition; University of Illinois annual, and others. In regional competition he was awarded two mural commissions by the U. S. Treasury Department.

The latest paintings of those to be exhibited are of an experimental nature, using Duco (automobile lacquer) instead of the traditional oil.
