By your generous gifts of cash and books, you have shown a genuine interest in making The University of Tennessee Library measure up to the stature that it should possess in its role as the "heart" of a great State University. During the past five years you have added approximately 50,000 books to the shelves of the libraries at Knoxville, Memphis, Martin, and Nashville, and in so doing you have contributed to the success of thousands upon thousands of students and faculty members who will use these books for many years to come.

For your information, following is a summary of gifts for the five years recorded in four reports:

\$24,021.77 and 8,955 books (1st Report, 18 months)
11,303.12 and 4,568 books (2nd Report, 12 months)
23,029.12 and 5,081 books (3rd Report, 18 months)
38,684.60 and 5,088 books (4th Report, 12 months)
\$97,038.61 and 23,692 books (Total, four Reports)

As I am sure all of you know, the inspiration and guiding light in this entire effort has been Dr. John C. Hodges, Professor Emeritus of English, who voluntarily accepted this project because of his abiding interest in the University. You have responded magnificently to his call, and all of us are most grateful.

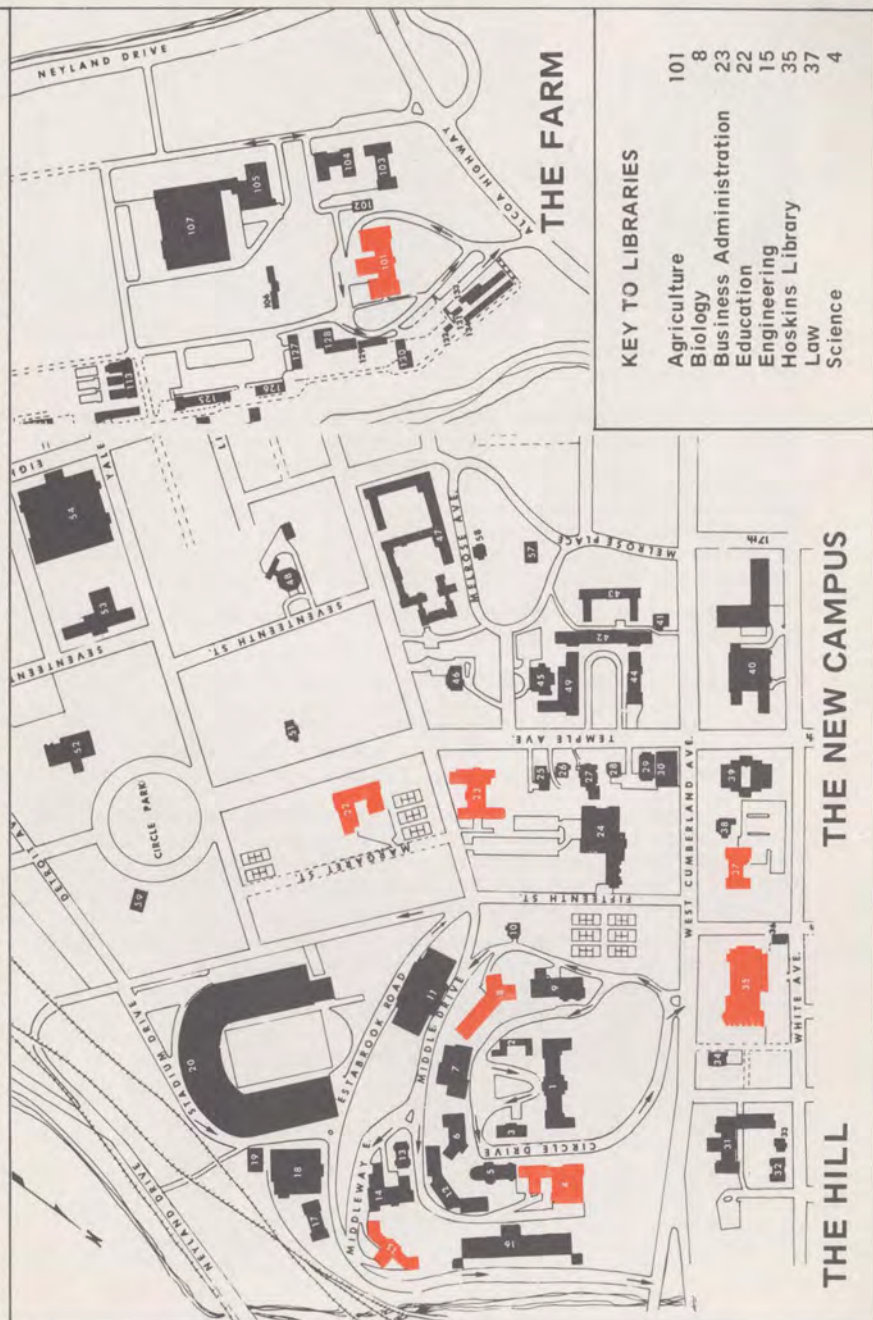

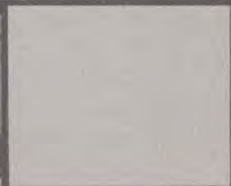

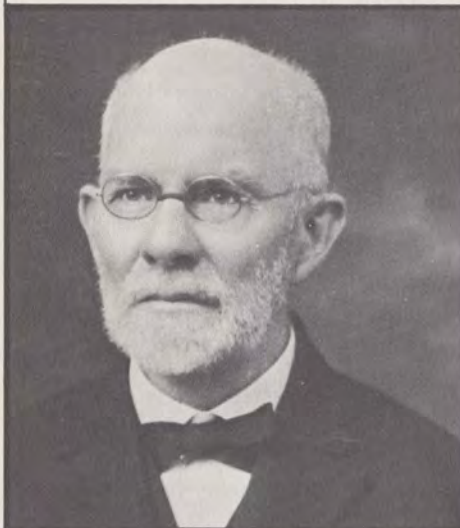
