The meeting was called to order by Sibyl Marshall, Chair, at 3:45 p.m.

The only item on the agenda was the Courses Not Taught in 4 or More Years Report.

The report listed 107 courses. After review and discussion of the courses, the Curriculum Committee voted to drop 52 courses and keep 55. Following the meeting, two Colleges corrected information on the courses and the totals are now changed to drop 49 and keep 58.

The Committee voted to drop some courses even though the departments indicated to retain them. In their deliberation, the Curriculum Committee reviewed the total number of years not taught (4-8 years) and the justifications provided.

R.J. Hinde noted there are no Arts and Sciences faculty on the Committee and asked that members be assigned to satisfy the Bylaws of the Curriculum Committee. Kay Reed acknowledged and agreed to work on the membership before the next meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:10p.m.

The next meeting is January 19, 2012, and all agenda items are due December 1.
