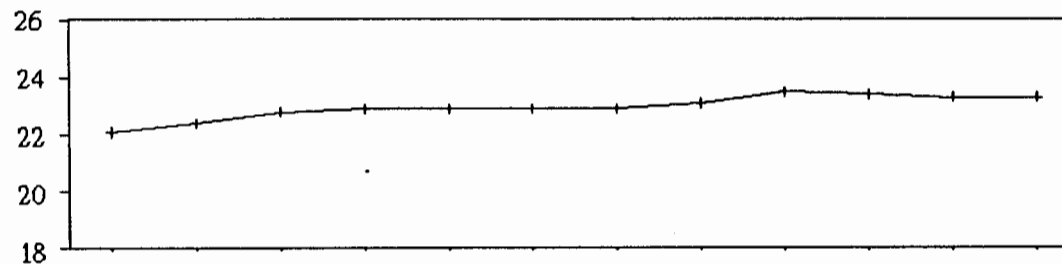

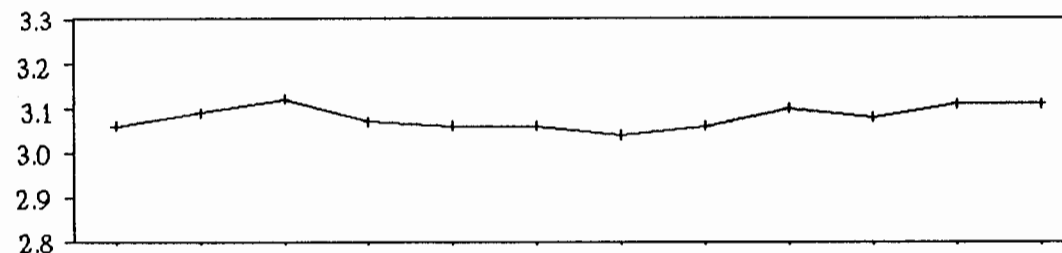

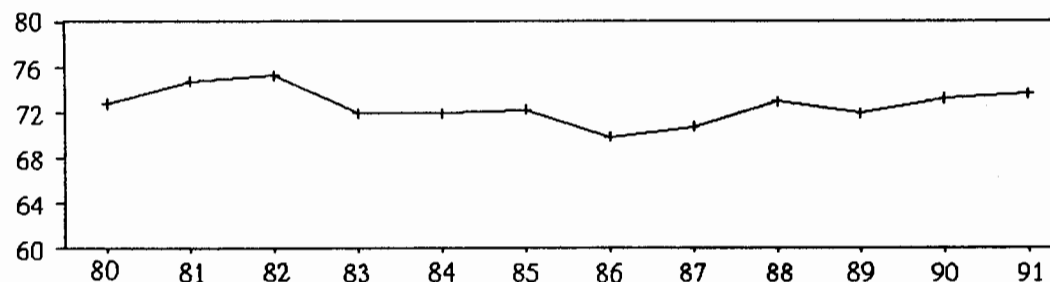
**ACT COMPOSITE

HIGH SCHOOL GPA

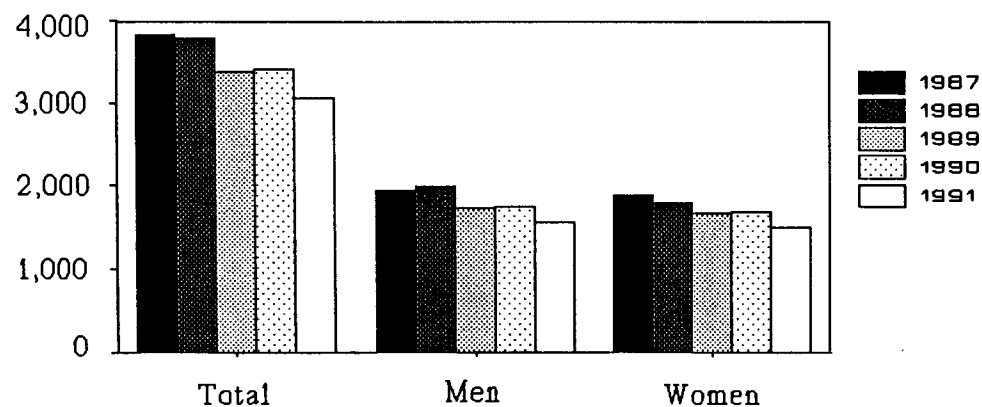


**HIGH SCHOOL PERCENTILE

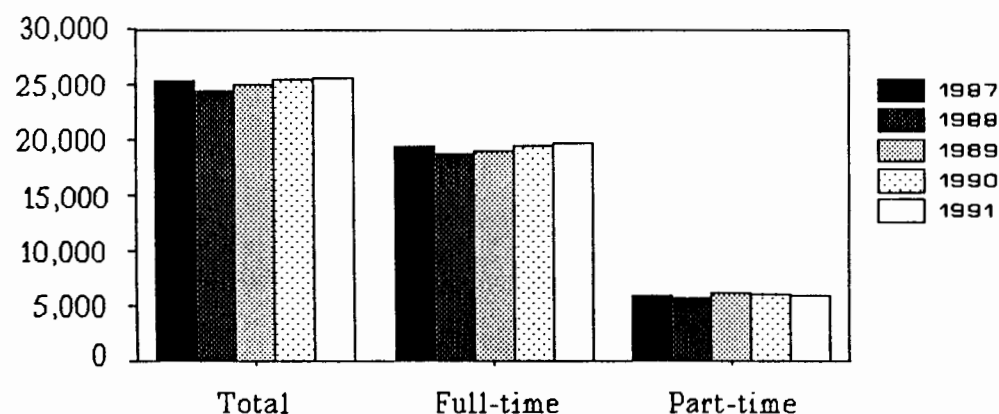

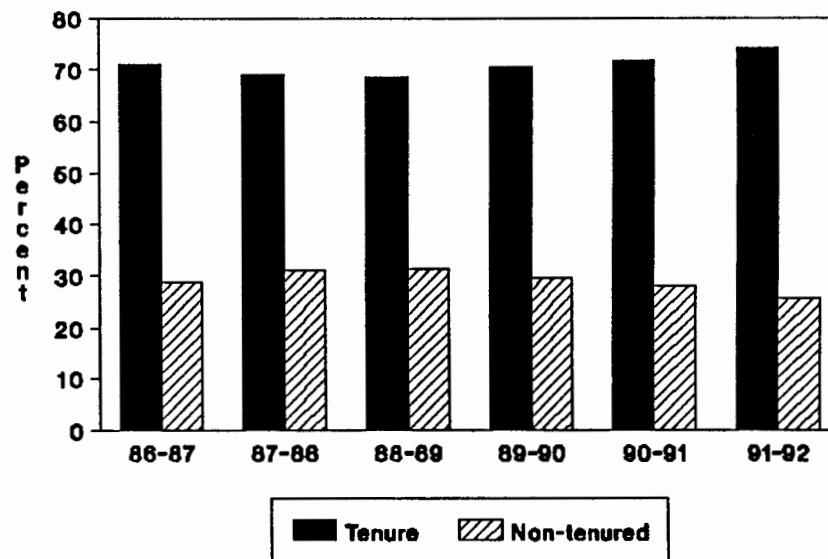

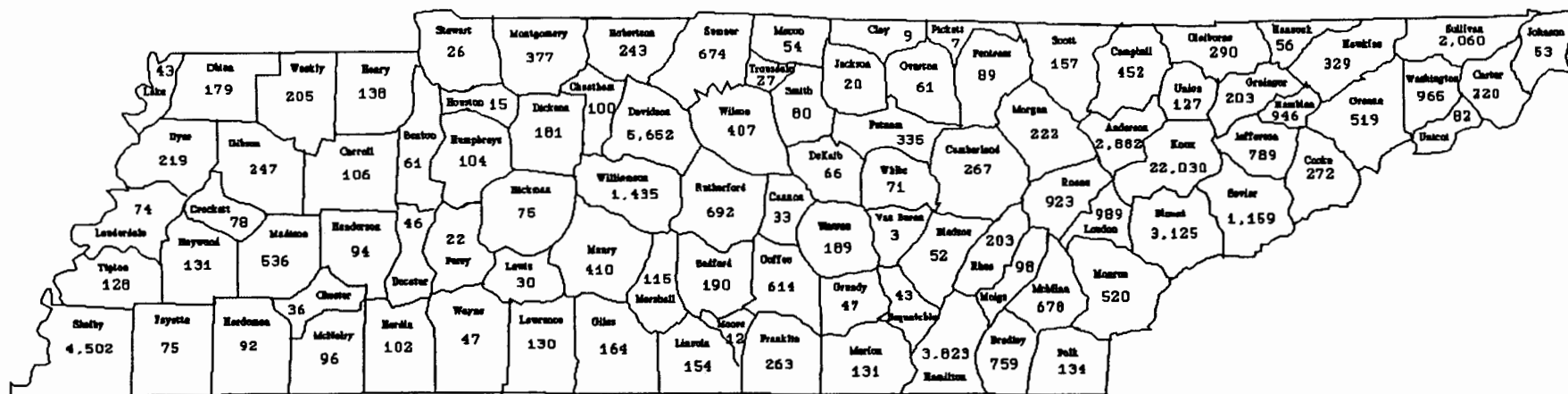
