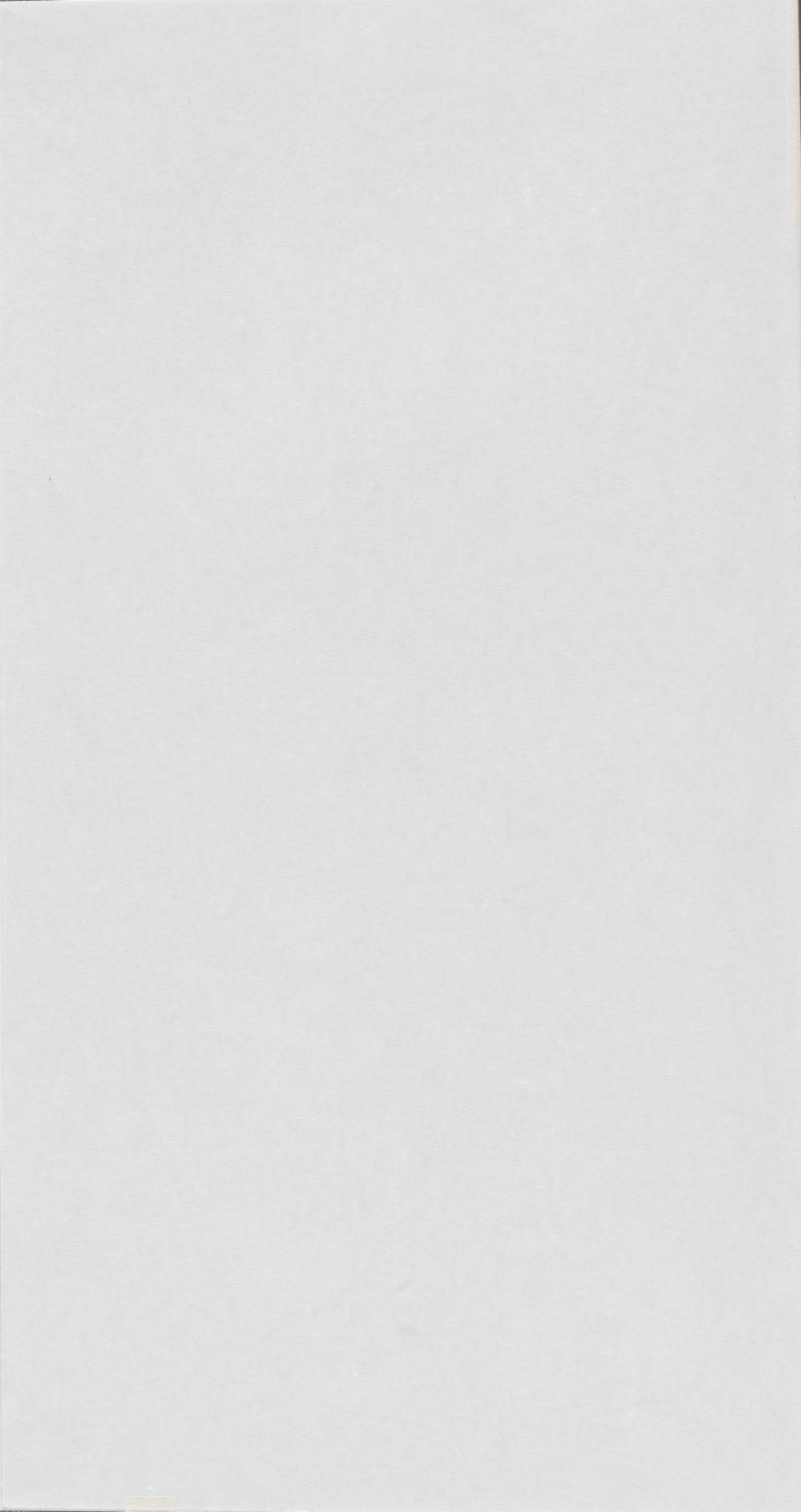

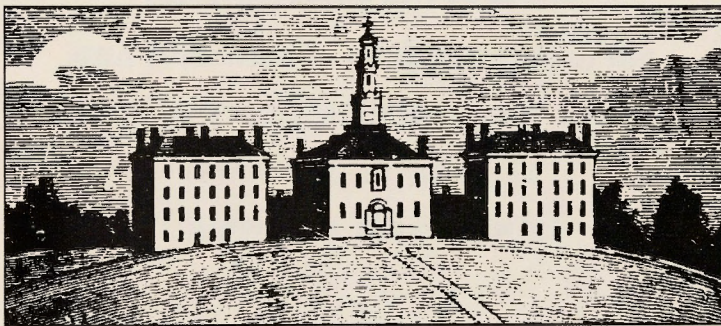

Introduction

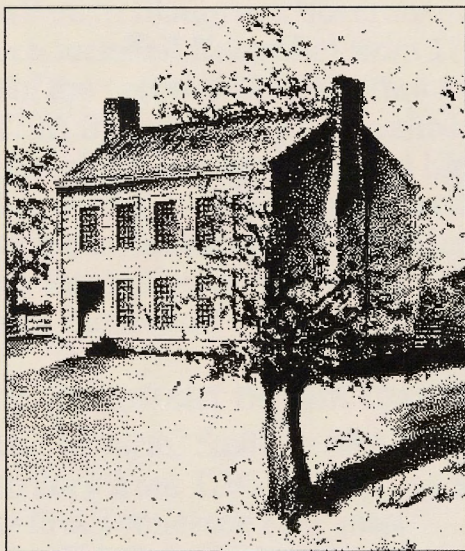
Tennessee was a wilderness territory when a handful of pioneers founded Blount College. The frontier school would become The University of Tennessee.

The University's 200-year history reflects the courage and determination of its founders. The early college, lacking leadership and funds, closed for 11 years in the early nineteenth century; the Civil War closed it again between 1862 and 1866. Designated Tennessee's state university in 1879, UT would wait another 24 years before the State Legislature offered any financial assistance. Two World Wars, the Depression, the upheaval of the sixties and the economic uncertainties of the present have offered new challenges at every stage of the University's development.

Since its founding, UT has been guided and governed by a Board of Trustees. The vision and commitment of these men and women have charted the University's course through many difficult passages and continue to determine UT's direction today.

CHARTER TRUSTEES OF BLOUNT COLLEGE: 1794

THE REVEREND SAMUEL CARRICK, PRESIDENT

A native of Pennsylvania, Carrick moved to the area where Knoxville would be established around 1789. He founded two Presbyterian churches (one of them is First Presbyterian) before opening a small seminary in his home in 1792.

Carrick was a rare blend of courage, wit and energy. He taught all the classes and ran the college on a shoestring, skimping on his own salary to keep the doors open. When he died in 1809, the college owed him \$87.82.

WILLIAM BLOUNT, GOVERNOR OF THE TERRITORY

Soldier and statesman, Blount was born in North Carolina. He was a delegate from his home state at the Constitutional Convention of 1787 and also served as a member of the North Carolina Senate. Blount was Governor of the Southwest Territory (which included Knoxville) from 1790 to 1796. He served as one of the first two U.S. Senators from Tennessee from 1796 to 1797. Blount County was named for him.

Blount's daughter, Barbara, attended Blount College in the early 1800s, causing some historians to name Blount the first co-educational institution in the U.S. The Hill on which the UT campus was built was once called "Barbara Hill" in honor of Barbara Blount.

DANIEL SMITH, SECRETARY OF THE TERRITORY

A Virginian by birth, Smith served as Secretary of the Southwest Territory from 1790 to 1796. He made the chief surveys for the first Tennessee state map.

Smith was a U.S. Senator from Tennessee from 1798 to 1799 and 1805 to 1809. Smith County is named for him.

DAVID CAMPBELL

Campbell served as a judge of the Southwest Territory and a judge of the Superior Court of Tennessee. He was one of the U.S. Commissioners to superintend the boundaries imposed by the Treaty of the Holston in 1792.

JOSEPH ANDERSON

Anderson, born in Pennsylvania, led a life of public service. He was a judge of the Southwest Territory, a delegate to the Constitutional Convention of 1796, and a member of the committee that drafted the State Constitution. He served as U.S. Senator from Tennessee from 1797 to 1815 and was the first Comptroller of the U.S. Treasury from 1815 to 1836. Anderson County was named for him.

GENERAL JOHN SEVIER

A native of Virginia, Sevier was active in government and the military throughout his life. He was Governor of the State of Franklin from 1785 to 1788, a Brigadier General both in North Carolina and Tennessee, a Congressman from North Carolina, and first Governor of Tennessee from 1796 to 1801. Sevier County is named for him.

COLONEL JAMES WHITE

Founder of Knoxville, White sold a parcel of land on Gay Street to the Trustees of Blount College in 1795. He served as Chairman of the First County Court of Knox County and Commander of the Knox County Militia. He was a State Senator and an Elder of both Lebanon Church and First Presbyterian Church, for which he donated the land.

COLONEL ALEXANDER KELLY

Kelly was a Lt. Colonel in the Knox County Militia and a Representative from Knox County in the Territorial Assembly from 1794 to 1796. He was one of the commissioners to lay out the town of Maryville in 1795 and served as State Senator from Blount County from 1796 to 1797.

COLONEL WILLIAM COCKE

Cocke, a Virginian by birth, was a soldier and statesman. He fought at the Battle of King's Mountain, was Secretary of the State of Franklin, Territorial Attorney General, and member of the Territorial House of Representatives from 1794 to 1796. He was a delegate to the Constitutional Convention of

1796 and served on the committee that drafted the State Constitution. He was one of the first U.S. Senators from Tennessee. Cocke County was named for him.

WILLIE BLOUNT

The half brother of Territorial Governor William Blount, Willie Blount served as Governor of Tennessee from 1809 to 1815. He was joint owner of Barbara Furnace on Beaver Creek, where it is said the first iron was made in Tennessee.

JOSEPH HAMILTON

A lawyer originally from Virginia, Hamilton was a Charter Trustee of Greeneville College, Washington College, and East Tennessee College, as Blount College was renamed in 1807. He served as State Senator from Jefferson and Greene Counties from 1823 to 1825.

ARCHIBALD ROANE

A lawyer originally from Pennsylvania, Roane was a delegate from Jefferson County, Tennessee, to the Constitutional Convention of 1796. He was Governor from 1801 to 1803 and Judge of the Supreme Court from 1815 until his death. Roane County was named for him.

FRANCIS RAMSEY

Born in Pennsylvania, Ramsey came as a pioneer to Tennessee and held several government posts in the State of Franklin. He was a Charter Trustee of East Tennessee College, as Blount College was renamed in 1807. He was first President of the State Bank in Knoxville in 1820.

CHARLES MCCLUNG

A Pennsylvania native, McClung moved to the present state of Tennessee in 1788. He was a lawyer, surveyor and merchant who laid out the town of Knoxville. McClung served as a trustee of Knox County, a clerk of the County Court, and a delegate to the Constitutional Convention of 1796. He is said to have prepared the draft of the State Constitution.

GEORGE ROULSTONE

Roulstone was a proprietor of the *Knoxville Gazette* from 1791 to 1795. He was one of the first commissioners of Knoxville under the Territorial Charter of 1794 and served as the first Postmaster of Knoxville and as Clerk of the Tennessee Senate from 1796 to 1799. He was publisher and editor of the *Knoxville Register* in 1798.

GEORGE MCNUTT

Born in Ireland, McNutt was a member of the first County Court of Knox County in 1792 and was Commissioner of Knoxville in 1797. He was an elder of Lebanon Church and of the First Presbyterian Church in Knoxville.

JOHN ADAIR

Adair, a native of Ireland, fought in the Revolutionary War. He was a member of the first County Court of Knox County, a commissioner of Knox County, and a delegate to the Constitutional Convention of 1796. He was an elder of the First Presbyterian Church of Knoxville.

ROBERT HOUSTON

Houston was the first sheriff of Knox County and also served as collector of public and county taxes. He was Senator from Knox, Roane and Anderson Counties and was Secretary of State of Tennessee from 1807 to 1811.

The lists are organized alphabetically, chronologically, and by geographic area. Certain members of the Board serve or have served in an ex-officio capacity. These are the Governors of Tennessee, some Presidents of the University, the Superintendents of Public Instruction, the Commissioners of Education, the Commissioners of Agriculture, the Secretaries of State, and the Executive Directors of the Tennessee Higher Education Commission. All ex-officio members are listed on pages 35 and 36.

In 1974, Governor Winfield Dunn signed legislation providing for a voting student member of the Board of Trustees. Each student member serves a one-year term. A complete list of student trustees appears on page 37.

THE UNIVERSITY OF TENNESSEE

Board of Trustees
1794-1994

Listed by Geographical Area

Prior to 1879, trustees came only from East Tennessee counties and represented their area of residence. When East Tennessee University became the University of Tennessee in 1879, board representation was expanded to include members from each congressional district.

The General Assembly passed an act stating "that no further vacancies be filled in the Board of Trustees of the University of Tennessee until the number thereof is reduced by death or resignation, or otherwise, below thirty, and that in filling vacancies thereafter up to the number of thirty, preference shall be given to congressional districts not represented in the Board until each congressional district shall have at least one representative on the Board of Trustees."

By 1892, the number was such that appointments could be made to accommodate representatives from each district. On May 3, 1892, the Board of Trustees nominated 12 individuals from nine congressional districts giving each district at least one representative.

As the University grew beyond Knoxville, members were added to represent larger cities and counties, and new campus sites.

- Anderson, Bedford, Coffee, Franklin, Lincoln, Moore, and Warren Counties UT Space Institute and Oak Ridge
- Davidson County UT Nashville
- Hamilton County UT Chattanooga
- Knox County UT Knoxville
- Shelby County UT Memphis
- Weakley County UT Martin

Beginning in 1974, student members were included, each student to serve one year.

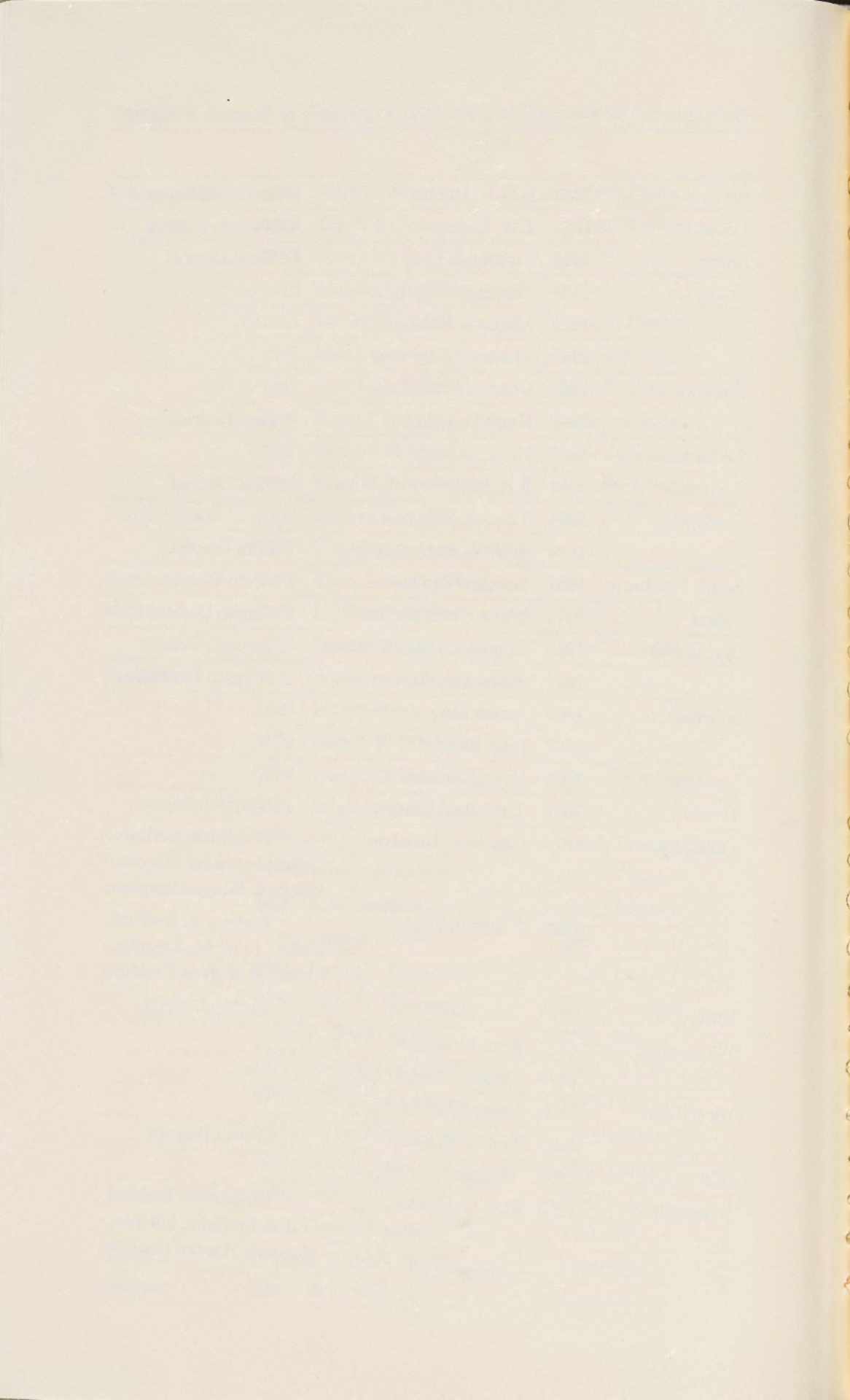

List of Ex-Officio Members

Certain members of the Board of Trustees serve or have served in an ex-officio capacity.

The president of the University was declared an ex-officio member of the board in 1909. Prior to that time, the trustee status of the president is unclear. Records indicate that most presidents of the University attended meetings of the Board of Trustees, but whether or not they were voting members remains uncertain.

The list below contains the names of all the presidents since 1794. Those whose trustee status was uncertain are marked with an asterisk (*) after the beginning service date.

In 1869, the University was named Tennessee's land grant institution and the Governor, the Secretary of State and the Superintendent of Public Instruction became ex-officio board members.

In 1909, the Secretary of State was replaced on the board by the Commissioner of Agriculture. In 1923, the Superintendent of Public Instruction was renamed the Commissioner of Education.

In 1967, the General Assembly created the Tennessee Higher Education Commission. The Commission's Executive Director is also an ex-officio member of the board, but does not vote.

HOW THE BOARD WORKS

The University of Tennessee is governed by a Board of Trustees. This 24-member lay board controls the entire state-wide University, including all the campuses and institutes.

The Board

- makes policies about general operations and educational opportunities (planning and developing the curricula are specifically designated to the faculties).
- elects the president and other University officers.
- oversees UT's budget.
- establishes admission, progression, and retention standards.
- approves new degree programs.
- grants tenure.
- controls all organizations that bear the UT name.

Of the 24 members, 19 are appointed by the governor and five serve because of the offices they hold in state government—the governor, the state commissioners of education and agriculture, the president of the University, and the executive director of the Tennessee Higher Education Commission (a non-voting member). The appointed members serve six-year terms, except for the student member, whose term is for one year. One member is appointed from each of Tennessee's nine congressional districts. Additional members are appointed from the areas where UT has campuses and offices: two members from Knox County, two from Shelby County, one each from Weakley, Hamilton, and Davidson counties, and one from either Anderson, Bedford, Coffee, Franklin, Lincoln, Moore, or Warren counties.

A chairman and a vice chairman are elected biennially by fellow Board members. The members also biennially elect the Board secretary, who need not be a member of the Board and who may also be the University's general counsel.

The Board meets at least three times a year. The “annual” meeting in June and the fall meeting usually take place in Knoxville in the Board Room on the eighth floor of Andy Holt Tower. The winter meeting often is held on another campus or in Nashville. Called meetings take place as needed. All the sessions are open to the public.

Several standing committees facilitate the work of the Board. These committees consider items of business and recommend action to the full Board. Committee meetings also are open to the public.

The president appoints faculty members to several board committees as non-voting members. Their role is to provide faculty opinion and input that trustees can use in making decisions. Students have similar representation on committees.

The standing committees are outlined on page 44.

HIGHER EDUCATION'S STRUCTURE

Public higher education in Tennessee is coordinated by the Tennessee Higher Education Commission and comprises two systems:

- the University of Tennessee system, governed by the UT Board of Trustees; and,
- the State University and Community College System of Tennessee, governed by the Board of Regents.

The members of the Higher Education Commission are: Chairman Tom Jessee, Steve Adams, Riley Darnell, Ruth Holmberg, Joe Lancaster, John Parish, C. Brent Poulton (ex- officio), James M. Powers Sr., Peaches Simpkins, William Snodgrass, Hunter Welles, and A.C. Wharton Jr.

Dr. Charles Smith is chancellor of the State University and Community College System, the counterpart position to UT's president.

WHAT THE COMMITTEES DO

The standing committees of the Board consider most items of business before they are brought before the full Board.

The **Executive Committee** can act for the full Board between regularly scheduled meetings. It has five members, always including the Board vice chairman. It can approve the buying and selling of property and the appointment of University officials.

The **Finance Committee** handles all matters relating to finance and business, including the investment of University funds, operating and capital outlay budgets, fees, buildings, and property.

The **Academic Committee** deals with proposals for new academic programs or changes in existing programs. The members also act on new academic organizations, admission and retention standards, and faculty personnel policies.

The **Agriculture Committee** considers policies and proposals concerning the Institute of Agriculture.

The **Development, Alumni Affairs, and Governmental Relations Committee** acts on matters affecting general financial support of the University from all sources and advises the University on alumni affairs and governmental relations.

The **Faculty and Staff Affairs Committee** handles faculty and staff benefits, employee rights and privileges, and other personnel matters.

The **Student Affairs Committee** oversees student matters, including rights and privileges, discipline, and activities.

The **Health Affairs Committee** considers policies and proposals about UT Memphis and other health programs throughout the state.

The **Public Service, Continuing Education, and University Relations Committee** is concerned with non-agricultural public service and continuing education programs and with university relations services.

The trustees also govern intercollegiate athletics on all the campuses that have those programs. These campuses have athletics boards, and members of the Board of Trustees serve on those boards.

The standing committees meet at least once a year. The members are appointed by the Board on the recommendation of the vice chairman, with the advice and consent of the Executive Committee. Committee members serve two-year terms.

As already mentioned, the University president may appoint faculty, staff, and students to one- or two-year terms as ex-officio, non-voting members of standing committees other than the Executive Committee and the Finance Committee.

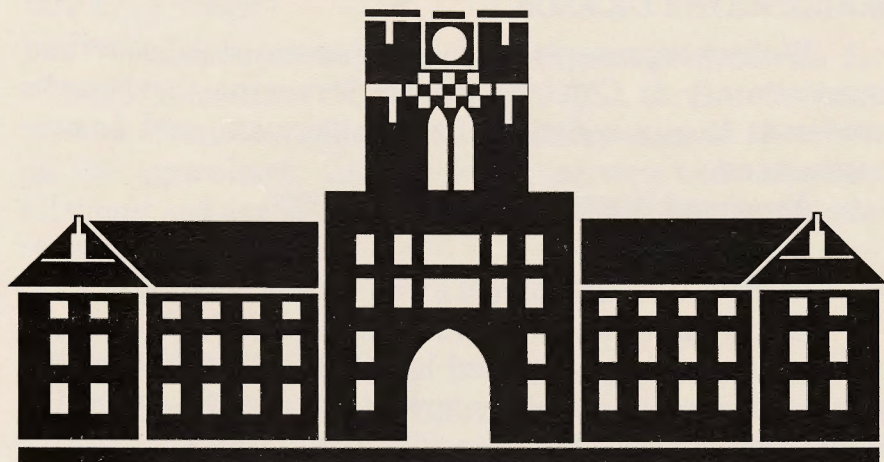

Tennessee's 46th governor is a native of Weakley County. From 1968 to 1986, he served in the state House of Representatives, where he was speaker for seven consecutive terms.

HOUSTON GORDON, VICE CHAIRMAN

Gordon represents the eighth congressional district. He is an attorney in Covington and an alumnus of UT Knoxville. He serves on the Board's executive, agriculture, faculty and staff affairs, health affairs, and student affairs committees.

DEBORAH BOWLES CROM

Crom is this year's student representative on the Board. She earned her B.S.N. and M.S.N. degrees at UT Memphis and holds an M.S. in Management from Memphis State University. A Pediatric Nurse Practitioner, she is currently a Ph.D. student in the College of Graduate Health Sciences (Nursing) at UT Memphis.

ROGER WAYNE DICKSON

Dickson represents the third congressional district and is an attorney in Chattanooga. He serves on the Board's academic, faculty and staff affairs (chairman), and finance committees.

Appointed: 1991 • Term expires: 2000

TOM ELAM

Elam represents the eighth congressional district. He is an attorney in Union City and has served on the Board 38 years—longer than any other current member. He earned his UTK undergraduate degree in 1931 and his law degree, also from Knoxville, in 1934. He chairs the executive committee and also serves on the academic committee and the development, alumni affairs, and governmental relations committee.

Appointed: 1956 • Current term expires: 2000

J. STEVEN ENNIS

Ennis represents Anderson, Bedford, Coffee, Franklin, Lincoln, Moore, and Warren counties on the Board. He lives in Tullahoma, where he is president of the local Coca-Cola Bottling Corporation. Ennis chairs the student affairs committee and is vice chairman of the finance committee. He also is a member of the academic committee.

Appointed: 1988 • Term expires: 2000

AMON CARTER EVANS

Evans represents the seventh congressional district. He raises cattle in Columbia, Tennessee. He is a former chief executive officer of the Nashville *Tennessean* and of Newspaper Printing Corporation. He is vice chairman of the public service and university relations committee and serves on the agriculture and executive committees.

ROY C. FLOWERS

Flowers represents the fifth congressional district. He was graduated from UT Knoxville in 1954. He lives in Nashville, where he has real estate and farming interests. He serves on the agriculture; finance; public service and university relations; and development, alumni affairs, and governmental relations committees.

JOSEPH OWEN FULLER

Fuller lives in Kingsport and represents the first congressional district. He is an attorney and holds degrees from UT Martin ('49) and the College of Law at Knoxville ('52). McWhorter serves on the development, alumni affairs, and governmental relations committee; the public service and university relations committee; and the health affairs committee.

NANCY J. OVERTON

Overton represents Weakley County on the Board. She is a UT Martin graduate and a retired teacher and coordinator for the Weakley County School System. She chairs the academic committee and also serves on the agriculture; development, alumni affairs, and governmental relations; student affairs; and public service and university relations committees.

Appointed: 1991 • Term expires: 1996

D. WAYNE QUALLS

Qualls is state commissioner of education and former superintendent of Hickman County Schools. His home is in Centerville. Qualls is on three committees: academic, faculty and staff affairs, and student affairs.

Term: 1993-1994

EDWARD W. REED

Reed lives in Memphis and represents Shelby County. He is a surgeon. He is vice chairman of the health affairs committee and serves on the public service and university relations committee and the faculty and staff affairs committee.

Appointed: 1990 • Term expires: 1996

ARLISS L. ROADEN

Roaden is executive director of the Tennessee Higher Education Commission. He lives in Brentwood and holds master's ('58) and Ed.D. ('61) degrees from UT Knoxville. He is a member of the Board's academic committee; the develop-

ment, alumni affairs, and governmental relations committee; and the faculty and staff affairs committee. He will continue to serve on the Board as long as he is THEC executive director.

KING W. ROGERS III

Rogers, a Memphis resident, represents Shelby County. He is an attorney and a UTK graduate. Rogers chairs the development, alumni affairs, and governmental relations committee and also serves on the health affairs and the public service and university relations committees.

Appointed: 1990 • Term expires: 1996

WILLIAM B. SANSOM

Sansom represents the second congressional district. He lives in Knoxville, where he is chairman and chief executive officer of H.T. Hackney Co. Sansom chairs the finance committee and also is a member of health affairs.

Appointed: 1986 • Term expires: 1995

RONALD A. TERRY

Terry represents the ninth congressional district. He lives in Memphis and is chairman of the board of First Tennessee National Corp. Terry serves on three committees: academic; development, alumni affairs, and governmental relations; and health affairs.
