LEARNING CURVE: UT DISTANCE EDUCATION SEES HUGE GROWTH IN PAST DECADE



The growth of UT Knoxville's distance education program in the past 10 years has been dramatic. In the 2000-01 academic year, there were 514 enrollments in distance education; in 2008-09, there were 2,613. And this fall's enrollment is up 328 over last fall.
