HRSA Funds Nurse Anesthesia Program

This additional funding will allow the College to employ additional faculty and increase enrollment from 15 to 30 students for the 3-year period of the grant funding. Fourth Annual Community of Scholars Summer Research Retreat

The College of Nursing hosted the Summer Research Retreat at Club Leconte on July 21, 2010. Forty doctoral students and faculty attended this year's retreat. The focus of the workshop was mixed methods research. Our speakers were Dr. R. Burke Johnson, Professor at the University of South Alabama, Dr. Edith Morris, Associate Professor at the University of Cincinnati, and Karen Burkett, MSN, Doctoral Student at the University of Cincinnati.

Hanover Grants

The College of Nursing has contracted with Hanover Grants, a professional grant writing firm. Dr. Jeffrey Hensley, the Chief Grants Officer from Hanover met with administrators from the College and the University and with faculty interested in writing grant proposals on July 22, 2010. We are looking forward to a productive working relationship with Hanover. They have already begun the process of helping us to find funding and to write competitive proposals.

Dr. Susan Speraw to Give Keynote Address

Dr. Speraw has been invited to give the keynote address at the Dorothy Waffarn Memorial Lecture at the University of California, Irvine (UCI), in January, 2011. This annual lectureship is a joint effort of the Program in Nursing Science and the Department of Pediatrics at UCI. This annual lecture features prominent speakers from nursing and medicine who have expertise in issues related to improving outcomes for children and their families. Susan has been asked to speak about disaster preparedness for children and families, children with disabilities, and children with special healthcare needs.

Faculty in the College of Nursing have been selected for Innovative Technology Consulting's Faculty First 2010 Program. Dr. Maureen Nalle and Laurie Acred-Natelson will develop modules on teamwork and collaboration for three courses: N311, N331, and N451. Teamwork and collaboration are competencies proposed by the Quality and Safety Education Network (QSEN). Dr. Gary Ramsey, Dr. Maureen Nalle, and Allie Brown will develop a learning module titled, Online RN-BSN Orientation. This module will provide information about the online learning process and online resources.

Faculty Workshop, Monday, August 16, 2010

Dr. Linda Norman, from Vanderbilt University, will be conducting a faculty workshop on Monday, August 16, 2010 from 1-4 PM to introduce the Quality and Safety Education in Nursing (QSEN) initiative. Vanderbilt was one of the pilot QSEN programs and Dr. Norman was instrumental in the curricular integration of QSEN competencies. Her presentation will include a discussion of QSEN background and implementation with a focus on faculty role and curriculum strategies.
