SUBJECT CFB Student Affairs Committee Meeting

Ralph,

I wish to bring to your attention several issues of considerable significance particularly to Black students. At the AASLF meeting held on February 16 1977, the students expressed concern about the effect of the Proposal to average all grades in the grade point average, even those which have been repeated. In general, the students seem to feel that if this proposal is accepted and implemented, it will have an adverse affect on many Black students. I indicated that I would ask the CFB Commiteeee on Student Affairs examine the issues and make a recommendation to the CFB concerning the appropriate action that we should take with respect to this particular issue. Further, there was a brief statement made about the drop/add issue. Do you think this too is a concern that your Committee should examine?

May I rely on you to schedule a meeting as soon as possible to examine these important issues? Finally, my secretary can assist you in setting up the meeting if you wish.
