Discussion of Implementing Academic Policies on <u>Continuous Enrollment</u>, <u>Consequences of Non-Enrollment</u>, and <u>Leave of Absence</u>

The members of the Academic Policy Committee worked on drafting three new policy statements that address Continuous Enrollment, Consequences of Non-Enrollment, and Leave of Absence.

The outcome of this meeting was a set of preliminary drafts for these academic policies. These drafts will be further scrutinized during the next APC meeting on February 6, 2014. During the February 6 meeting, APC will also cross-check which current academic policies will need to be adjusted if we implement academic policies on Continuous Enrollment, Consequences of Non-Enrollment, and Leave of Absence. It is anticipated that the APC report of Feb. 6, 2014 will contain the new policy proposals along with a list of changes to current academic policies that would become necessary as a consequence implementing the suggested three policies.
