ANNUAL REPORT, 1964/65

During 1964/65 three new libraries were planned for the University of Tennessee: a separate undergraduate library at Knoxville, a new library for Martin, and an addition to Main in Knoxville to hold the Estes Kefauver Memorial Library.

The Director of Libraries, the associate director Ruth Ringo, G. M. Abel, and Katherine Montague (Undergraduate Librarian) acted as advisor-consultants in the development of Martin's library plans. The undergraduate library was planned by a committee appointed by the Academic Vice President (The Advisory Committee on the Planning of an Undergraduate Library), two consultants, and library administrative officers. A committee for the Kefauver Memorial Wing, selected in June 1965, met five times that month and made plans for space to hold the Kefauver papers and personal mementos, working areas for scholars and historians, and a reconstruction of his Washington office.

The new construction will relieve the crowded reader/book accommodations for a while, but only 13.8 per cent of the 1964 fall enrollment on the Knoxville campus (14,111 students) can be seated in the libraries. We want to have seats for 25 per cent of the official planning figure of 25,000 students (including 7,000 in the graduate school) the day the enrollment reaches that level. Presently we seat 1,167 in Main, and we hope ultimately to have 3,000 reader stations in the undergraduate library (the initial unit will hold only 2,000) and to accommodate 2,083 readers in the branches by adding 1,397 stations as expansion space is made available to these badly overcrowded outlets.

The fifteen-year-old Science Library, serving the chemistry, physics, geography, geology, mathematics, chemical and nuclear engineering departments, needs space for books, readers, and staff. The Engineering Library has outgrown its quarters in Ferris Hall. Infrequently used materials are stored elsewhere on the campus; we attempt to make these available on 24-hour notice. To improve services and accommodations in the areas of the basic and applied sciences, a combined science-technology library is being contemplated.

The Biology Library moved into new quarters in the fall of 1964 with twice the floor space of its old housing, but little-used books will soon have to be stored elsewhere on the campus. When the present Administration Building is vacated, perhaps Biology can expand into the released space.

The Agriculture Library has outgrown its quarters, and storage is necessary there, too. It is expected that new buildings on the Agriculture Campus in the next three years will release space in Morgan Hall for the library's expansion.

The branch libraries in the social science (Business, Education, Law) are reaching capacity. Larger quarters will be sought when additions are planned to the buildings of the various colleges.

The recently added programs in architecture and planning will in all likelihood require new library facilities.

Library Use and Service

Public Services

The recorded use of books on the Knoxville campus increased 13.7 per cent over last year. The librarians at the Main Library loan desks handed out 8.2 per cent more books, and increases in the branches went from 2.5 per cent in Agriculture to 67.4 per cent in the Biology Library, which occupied its new quarters in the Hesler Building addition in September 1964.

Interlibrary loans lent to other libraries rose 18.6 per cent; those borrowed from other libraries increased 4.2 per cent.

The recorded reference questions increased 10.6 per cent. Tables of circulation and reference statistics for each library are appended.

The following figures show the state-wide pattern of circulation of books for the past five years.

The Acquisitions Department spent almost \$50,000 more on books, periodicals and binding than last year. Outstanding additions to the collection are listed in the appendix to this report.

The Processing Department added 45,924 volumes to the collection, more than 8,300 over last year. Cataloging statistics are appended.

Library Support

Formally budgeted funds for the Knoxville libraries were increased \$51,000. In addition, allocations were made for books of \$50,000 from the University and \$4,500 from NASA. The Library Development Program received \$54,698 and more than 8,000 books from alumni and library friends.

The attitude of the University Administration is sympathetic toward the library; the Graduate School office is alert to the needs of the graduate programs; the faculty preponderantly is active and interested. This atmosphere has resulted in stronger book collections for most of the schools and colleges. The Basic Sciences are strong; book-buying for Engineering has been emphasized for several years. Agriculture remains strong. Home Economics and the Social Sciences are adequate; however, efforts to enrich the holdings of all areas continue.

The Library Administration is deeply grateful for the many evidences of official and individual interest in and concern for the library's staff, housing, and collections.

Staff Activities

Staff travel for education and observation of new library buildings, automated processes, and technical advances increased during the year. The new undergraduate library building planning and discussions regarding automation of the book-charging and book-ordering procedure brought about several trips by the staff: Mr. Abel, Library Automation Conference sponsored by IBM at Endicott, New York; Grand Valley State College in Michigan; Florida Atlantic University, Boca Raton (with Mr. Jesse). Paul Trentham and Don Jett attended the Clinic on Library Applications of Data Processing at the University of Illinois in Urbana, then saw the new University of Illinois Library in Chicago with Katherine Montague, who also visited Stephens College in Columbia, Missouri.

Participation in local and regional professional and education associations took several staff members to various meetings and conferences: As members of evaluation teams for the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, Miss Branch went to Charleston College (South Carolina); Mr. Abel to Hardin-Simmons College; Mr. Jesse to the University of South Florida (Tampa).

For the library associations, Miss Ringo and Mr. Jesse attended a workshop in Atlanta as members of committees to plan future programs of the Southeastern Library Association. John Dobson continued as editor of the Tennessee Librarian; Don Jett replaced G. M. Abel as business manager of the quarterly. Misses Montague and Mitchell, Mr. Jesse, G. M. Abel, John Dobson, and Stuart Garrett attended the annual Tennessee Library Association meeting in Memphis. Tom Rogero went to the Special Libraries Association conference in Philadelphia, and various staff members regularly attended the Oak Ridge Chapter's meetings.

Informational visits relative to techniques and procedures included those of Norman Watkins to the Southern Library Bindery (Nashville) and the University of Denver workshop on the care, binding, and repair of library books, and Aubrey Mitchell, Agriculture Librarian, to the forestry libraries at Syracuse, Harvard, and Duke Universities.

Recruitment trips were made by G. M. Abel (Florida State and Emory University library schools) and John Dobson (Carnegie Institute).

Several schools and colleges requested advisory assistance from library personnel: Mr. Jesse helped plan library buildings for Knoxville College, Lenoir Rhyne College, Eastern Kentucky, Villa Madonna, Clinch Valley, Lincoln Memorial, Union University, Bethel College, Georgetown University, and Radford College, with Mr. Abel's assistance on some. Mr. Dobson advised the Carnegie Institute of Technology on a special collections library.

The Mary E. Baker Scholarship (\$1,000) went to Mary Greer, cataloging assistant in the Processing Department. She will attend library school at Florida State University. This fund, underwritten by the professional staff, is maintained by fund-raising activities of the entire library personnel.

In recognition of the Library Development Program, the library staff sponsored an endowment fund for library books, which now totals \$1,250.

David L. Kaser, Director of Joint University Libraries, was guest speaker at the seventeenth annual library lecture. His paper, Academic Science and the University Library, was presented March 30.

All in all 1964/65 was a full, productive, and satisfying year.
