

I include in this list Vernon and Kappa Alpha Halls which are rented as buildings for a stipulated amount.

In addition to the above there are 10 rooms occupied in the Y.M.C.A. building by 21 occupants, making a total of 155 students and officers living in the University dormitories and paying rent.
