The committee reviewed a proposal from the Physician Executive MBA Program. The proposal asked that physicians licensed to practice medicine in the U.S. not be required to submit transcripts if their medical license can be verified; verification would take place in the College of Business. This proposal is a departure from the Graduate School requirement that all graduate applicants for admission must present official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended and that these transcripts reflect work completed at accredited universities with minimum grade-point averages as specified by the Graduate School. Dr. Michael Stahl, Director of the Physician Executive MBA Program, and Dr. Robert T. Ladd, Associate Dean of the College of Business Administration, presented more information related to the proposal. Standards for admission requirements and methods of handling exceptions to those standards were discussed by the committee.

The committee will return to review the proposal at its next meeting.
