





As the terminal degree for the practicing artist, the M.F.A. is designed to provide a three-year pre-professional transition between undergraduate years of promise to the emergence of maturing artists capable of meeting the demands and rigors of the independent practicing professional.

To help nurture this metamorphosis, our program gives each student a place to work and an opportunity to interact with 28 faculty, many prominent visiting artist/critics, and three resident artists each year. In addition, an active gallery program, housed in the same building as student studios, provides exposure to current trends in contemporary art.
