TROGIA CRISPA Fr.

Monogr. Hymen. Suec. 2:244. 1863

Pileus 5-12 mm. broad, up to 30 mm. when compound (or fused), nearly sessile, cupulate to shelving-dimidiolate, tomentose, "tawny-olive," margin pale to whitish, with a marginal depressed zone. Flesh white, thin; odor mild, taste astringent. Lamellae radiating from an eccentric point, white with a grey tint, rather close, narrow, nearly ridge-like, branched and anastomosed, edges blunt, smooth (even). Stipe short, lateral, tomentose.

Spores (none found; spore print failed). Pleurocystidia and cheilocystidia none.

Habitat and Distribution. - On birch, Tennessee, October.
