The Office of Student Orientation is committed to the expression of Cultural Diversity within our campus agency. In order to ensure the transmission of this cultural appreciation, we offer a program each year titled "Cultural Diversity at UT" as a separate and significant part of our Orientation Program. (Please see the attached program guide for specific listing of the program).

The actual program is designed to promote awareness of the various cultures and minority populations represented on the UT Campus. Specifically, the program consists of role playing, open dialogue, and small group discussions in which racism, discrimination, and the appreciation of different lifestyles are discussed. In the program format incoming students are asked to participate in short skits and a follow-up conversation in order to process the skits significance. Questions are encouraged, as well as group post-program conferences if needed. The program is sponsored by the Office of Minority Student Affairs and the Center for International Education. The Directors of these departments, Dr. Jane Redmond and Dr. James Gehlhar have served as program presenters and program hosts in past years.

In addition, the Office of Student Orientation provides specific training material and programs for our Student Orientation Assistants (SOA) staff regarding cultural appreciation. In past years, we have had contract speakers to deliver workshops on cultural racism, as well as in-house presentations by various UT Personnel. (Please find attached a copy of a past exercise used in this training for our reference). The goal of this training is to promote cultural awareness among these student leaders, so that in turn can promote this awareness to the incoming students and visiting parents during our summer program.
